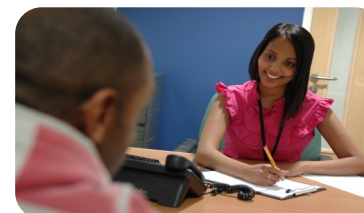

## Leaflet Three

### **Option 1: Stay at Home:**

Consider why you are leaving home. If you want to leave because you have family problems, it may be better to try to sort things out if you can. This way, you can leave at a time that suits you and plan any move. We can help you with this if you feel that you cannot communicate with your parents or carers.

### **Option 2: Family/Friends:**

Staying with friends or other family is probably the easiest and least stressful option, but it may only be short term. You will be with people you know. It also gives you breathing space to look into other options. If you are staying with friends or family temporarily, it will not affect the way we assess your housing situation.

### **Option 3: Finding own Place:**

Finding your own place can give you more freedom, independence and space, but it's not guaranteed to be a positive experience. Some people end up feeling isolated and unable to cope, in debt, or unhappy with where they are living. It's not easy to manage your own tenancy, and you may struggle to cope with paying rent and your bills.

If you have nowhere else to go there is a fourth option, If you are unable to return to your previous accommodation contact Tameside Housing Advice and we may be able to place you in temporary accommodation and refer you to a supported accommodation unit which is suitable for your individual needs.

After an appointment with the service they will place you on a waiting list until there is a place available.

When you move into supported accommodation you will receive support to help you move towards living independently in your own tenancy. When an agreement has been reached between you and your key worker that you are ready for independent living, referrals will be made to appropriate accommodation providers.

This may involve an application being put forward to Tameside council's housing register on your behalf, where you may then be rehoused by a Housing Association.

You will continue to receive support to help you with independent living.

To enable the move-on from supported accommodation into your own property there are certain things that are expected from you. You will have demonstrated the ability to maintain a tenancy and that you are complying the terms and conditions of your license or tenancy agreement.
